

## Career Street Mini-Grant Application

1. **Project Title:** Fairview High School Futures Month
2. **Contact Person:** Emily Crawford & Kimberly Jensen-School Counselors
3. **Timeline:** February 5<sup>th</sup>, 2016 (9<sup>th</sup> grade-126 students)  
February 11<sup>th</sup>, 2016 (10<sup>th</sup> grade-129 students)  
February 19<sup>th</sup>, 2016 (11<sup>th</sup> grade-120 students)
4. **Target Population and Number of Students:** We are targeting the school for futures month. This grant is for field trips for students in grades 9-11. The total number of students is: 375.

5. **Amount Requested:**

Three trips planned:

- 9<sup>th</sup> grade trip: 3 busses at \$150 each=\$450  
4 subs to chaperone at \$112 each=\$448  
Food at \$2 a person X 126 students=\$252  
TOTAL = \$1,150
- 10<sup>th</sup> grade trip: 3 busses at \$150 each=\$450  
4 subs to chaperone at \$112 each=\$448  
Food at \$2 a person X 129 students=\$258  
TOTAL = \$1,156
- 11<sup>th</sup> grade trip: 3 busses at \$150 each=\$450  
4 subs to chaperone at \$112 each=\$448  
Food at \$2 a person X 120 students=\$240  
TOTAL = \$1,138

**GRAND TOTAL=\$3,444**

**We are requesting \$3,000 for this grant and will cover the remaining costs from another funding source.**

6. **Statement of Need:** Students have a need for early university and STEM college program exposure. Early exposure can encourage student to keep their grades high and to choose high school curriculum that would benefit future college success.

7. **Description of Proposed Activities:**

- Presentations by Engineering, Business, Science, and Humanities
- Hands on STEM project that involves teamwork and critical thinking
- Lunch on campus
- A campus tour highlighting important aspects of a college campus
- Admissions Process Presentation

8. **Means of Continuing the Project After Funding:** Following the evaluation of the program, we would seek funding within the school budgeting process. We would also hope this might encourage future participation in free campus events such as: Women in Engineering Day, Business Day, Women in Business Day, Dual Enrollment, etc...

9. **Other Organizations Involved:** Penn State Behrend and Edinboro University

**10. In What Ways Can This Project Be Replicated By Other Districts:** Behrend offers a youth outreach program that any district can participate in. Edinboro also offers high school outreach for early college, major, and career exposure. Both campuses are willing to accommodate large groups of students. The barrier in this process is paying for buses, sub rates, and lunch. Both campuses require the school district to pay for these costs.

**11. Anticipated Outcomes and Deliverables:**

1. Keeping students local: These visits showcase amazing programs in Erie County. Staying local for college often results in students staying and working locally upon graduation.


**12. How will this project be measured?** Each student will be required to include a summary of a college visit within their graduation projects.

**13. How and with whom will project outcomes be shared?**


Outcomes will be shared with:

**14. How will this program be evaluated:** Unique surveys will be given to each grade level upon completion of the campus field trip. The use of google forms will be used to quickly analyze data. Students will be given this form in homeroom and asked to complete it on their individual iPad. The survey questions would be specific to both meeting Pennsylvania Career standards through the campus visit and also questions pertaining to the campus visit and events held while on the trip. Results can be compared to 2014 data collected from the last career day.
