The Pennsylvania State Police, in conjunction with the Kiwanis Club of Erie, invite you to join us for Camp Cadet.



The camp is open to boys and girls aged 13-15 (waiting list for 12-year-olds.)

The camp is designed to bring a better understanding of law enforcement and other community agencies to the youth who live in Erie, Warren, Crawford and Venango counties. The camp is a weeklong experience where cadets spend the entire week at Allegheny College.

While at camp, the cadets will experience numerous activities and events which are geared toward building self-esteem, self-discipline and new friendships.

Some blocks of instruction include demonstrations by various law enforcement agencies, Pennsylvania State Police Special Emergency Response Team (SERT) and the Pennsylvania State Police Helicopter.

The cadets will also be required to show respect, display discipline, and learn military courtesy.

In the evenings, time will be allotted for activities that promote good sportsmanship and platoon competition.

The week begins with check-in on Sunday (time will be assigned) and concludes with graduation 6 p.m. on Friday. Friends and family are encouraged to attend the graduation ceremony.

There is no cost for this camp, but cadets chosen to attend will be required to participate in an upfront fundraiser.
